Capacity Development

We strengthen capacities of local communities on different farming technologies to improve agricultural productivity, bolster food security, and enhance community resilience to climate change.

Provision of Agricultural Inputs

We provide farmers with reliable, high-quality, and certified agricultural inputs such as seeds and fertilizer. We hope to break the resource barriers that hold smallholder farmers, particularly women and youth farmers from thriving.





Financial & Market Linkages

We train farmers on financial literacy and link them to financial institutions like banks, Microfinance Institutions (MFI) and other Non-Governmental Organizations with financial resources.

Small Enterprise Development Support

We train farmers on record keeping, business planning, and financial management to promote small enterprise success.






Environmental Conservation & Policy Advocacy

Farmer Field Days Organized

New knowledge, skills, and technologies disseminated.

Agriculture Expo Organized

More than 300 farmers attended the grassroots Agri expo and interacted with manufacturers of agricultural inputs, financial institutions, and marketing organizations.

COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT

Farm Mechanization

Two farm machines, a garden seeder and a cultivator were introduced as pilot test to transform agriculture by moving away from the back-breaking manual labor.

Strengthening Women Groups

We have established twenty (20) new Self Help Groups (SHG) across our areas of intervention. Such groups are integral to farmers learning from each other and improving farming.





Linking Youths to Financial Resources

Through our partnerships with Kenya Commercial Bank, we have trained 200 youths on financial literacy and connected to the mainstream financial institution. Little by little the youth, especially in the Boda boda sector are saving money and accessing loan resources to kickstart both farm and non-farm enterprises.

Small Enterprise Development Support

We have helped 1200 women to kickstart small enterprises like soap making, kitchen gardens, and the production and selling of indigenous vegetables. Additionally, we link women self help groups to resources like markets and banks to access loan. M




While improving water access and sanitation has not been our focus in the past, the effects of climate change necessitated the shift. As a communitycentric organization, we foreground needs assessment to foster evidencebased decision-making. We listen to communities to identify their needs. As such, we address the bottlenecks and remove the hurdles holding communities back from thriving. It is against this backdrop that we drilled a borehole in Orembe village, Sino Kagola in Homa Bay County to address the perennial water challenge.

Some of the plans we have in the pipeline in 2024 and beyond include:

Promoting Climate Smart Agriculture

We are committed to promoting regenerative agriculture to boost food security and foster community resilience to climate change. Some of the agroecological practices we envision promoting include vermicomposting, biochar, and agroforestry.

Enhancing Smallholder Farm Mechanization

We hope to promote the shift from manual labor to smallholder farm machinery to improve efficiency and attract more young people in agriculture in line with Africa Agenda 2063.

Training Women Extension Paraprofessionals

Access to agricultural extension services remains an impediment to smallholder farmers in Africa, especially women and youth. We hope to augment inadequate government extension services by training additional women extension paraprofessionals to cascade culturally appropriate and gender specific intervention.

Leveraging Digital Technologies

To enhance extension outreach and improve farmer efficiencies from farm to fork, we aim to train communities on better digital technologies. and increase the penetration of such resources into marginalized communities leaving no one behind.

Partnerships for Sustainable Development

Achieving sustainable development goals calls for concerted efforts of all stakeholders, donors, and partners to mobilize resources and tackle the pressing challenges of our generation. Hence, we are keen on expanding our partnerships both at the grassroots and international level to amplify our impact and transform communities from surviving to thriving.
